

DRC stand on Genocide fugitives impressive- Rwandan Prosecutor General.

Minaffet, 5th, January 2009, Rwanda's Prosecutor General, Martin NGOGA expressed appreciations for the comments echoed by Mr. Thambwe Mwamba Alexis, the Minister of Foreign Affairs for Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) that his country would give attention to the list of over 6900 suspected to have perpetrated the 1994 Tutsi Genocide.

“There has been progress in the general framework of the Tripartite Plus in terms of normalizing the relations between the two countries, however, there has never been any particular development on the list Rwanda sent to DRC of FDLR rebels and Genocidaires before” the head of the National Public Prosecutions Authority (NPPA), Martin Ngoga told Rwanda English Daily, The New Times.

Martin NGOGA added that “the on-going bilateral talks between the two countries are paying off”.
Rwanda's Minister of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation Hon Rose Mary MUSEMINALI welcomed the comments made by her counterpart from DRC as “critically important and positive development”.
In the related development, DRC-Rwanda Defense Ministers recently met in Gesenyi (former Province of Rwanda) and their meeting was reported by Rwandan Press as “successful and fruitful”. Grouped in The Democratic Forces for the Liberation of Rwanda (FDLR), scores of Genocide suspects are still in DRC, a factor that has severed DRC-Rwanda relations in the past.
